Product overview

DB2[®] Document Manager is a Web-based client for managing controlled documents throughout their life cycles. You can use DB2 Document Manager to catalogue, edit, approve, publish, and archive a wide range of documents.

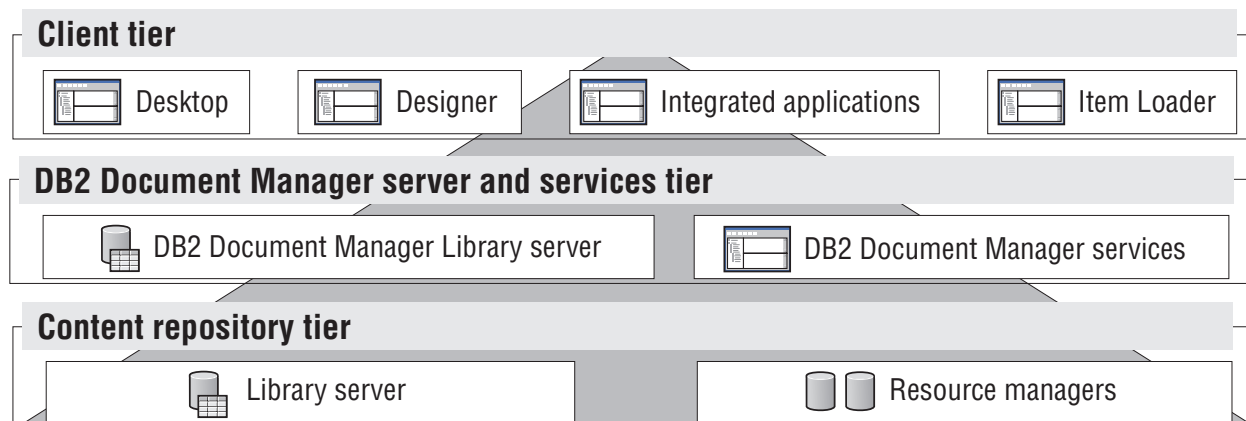
2 Step 2: Evaluate your hardware and system configuration

3 Step 3: Review the architecture

A DB2 Document Manager system consists of client programs, integrated applications, server programs, and a content repository. The following diagram shows the architecture of a DB2 Document Manager system.



4 Step 4: Install the content repository



DB2 Document Manager uses a DB2 Content Manager repository or a FileNet Panagon Content Services repository. Install the content repository and the required components. 5 Step 5: Prepare the content repository



Before you install DB2 Document Manager, you must have a repository system installed and working:

- For DB2 Content Manager, see "Preparing DB2 Content Manager" in *Planning and Installing DB2 Document Manager*.
- For FileNet Panagon, see "Preparing FileNet Panagon" in *Planning and Installing DB2 Document Manager*.

6 Step 6: Install and configure DB2 Document Manager

7 Step 7: Configure DB2 Document Manager services



Configure the base DB2 Document Manager services and any optional services for your document management system.

To configure a service:

1. Complete "Configuring DB2 Document Manager services" in *Planning and Installing DB2 Document Manager*.
2. Configure the services appropriate for your system by completing the following sections in the *System Administration Guide*:
 - "Configuring Automation Services"
 - "Configuring Cache Manager"
 - "Configuring a Life Cycle"
 - "Configuring Notifications"
 - "Configuring Print/Plot Services"
 - "Configuring Rendition Services"

8 Step 8: Design the DB2 Document Manager Desktop



Design and configure the DB2 Document Manager Desktop to create a document management system that is tailored to the needs of your users. For information, see "Designing the Desktop" in the *System Administration Guide*.

9 Step 9: Deploy the DB2 Document Manager Desktop



After you design the Desktop, set up a Web server to deploy the Desktop installation files to users. For instructions, see Deploying the Desktop in *Planning and Installing DB2 Document Manager*.
