Welcome to the IBM Tivoli Identity Manager Solaris NIS Adapter.

Adapter Features and Purpose

The Solaris NIS Adapter is designed to create and manage NIS accounts on an Solaris system. This Adapter must be installed on the Solaris NIS Master system to be managed by ITIM. The Adapter does not create or manage local UNIX accounts. Use the Solaris Adapter for this purpose.

The Solaris NIS Adapter is a powerful tool that requires Administrator Level authority. The Adapter operates much like a human system administrator, creating Accounts, assigning Groups and creating Home Directories. Operations requested from the Identity Manager server will fail if the Adapter is not given sufficient authority to perform the requested task. IBM recommends that this Adapter run with administrative (root) permissions.

The following corrections to the Installation Guide apply to this release:

Agent Account:

The account, which the Agent will run from, must comply with the following:

- The agent account must have full permissions on the directory that contains the Solaris Agent software.
- The Agent account must be registered in Solaris with administrator role (root).

Agent Administration for NIS mode:

- Modify - After home directory is modified at ITIM server, user needs to wait for 5-6 minutes before the changes are reflected, and then user can log in at the managed resource.
- Restore - After restore operation is completed at ITIM server, user needs to wait minimum for 5 minutes before user can log in at the managed resource.
- "Force Password Change" - function is not implemented in Solaris NIS mode.
