## Scope

- We show how to migrate a fairly simple Process, the Credit Request sample of WebSphere MQ Workflow.
- The FDL (WebSphere MQ Workflow flow definition language) file can be directly imported into WebSphere Integration Developer v6.2.
- We concentrate here on the process itself, we do not demonstrate the migration of activity implementations, topology and staff.
- The converted process is then tested with the BPC Explorer.





#### The Credit Request Process

- A process to collect data and
- approve or reject the request for a credit. A WebSphere MQ Workflow Buildtime screenshot of the process:







- In the Business Integration perspective of WebSphere Integration Developer, from the drop-down menues you select:
  - File
  - Import
  - Business Integration
  - WebSphere MQ Workflow FDL File

If you do not want to use this predefined data in the process model, you can avoid unnecessary overhead by clearing this box.

Then, the first ToDo task shows up and can be started:





After starting the task, input and output variables show up.

Note that with the original program implementations in WebSphere MQ Workflow, the input variables are copied to the output variables which is not performed here with the default rendering.
